Tips for Using Book Group in a Bag Services

- The Online Reservation System lets you plan ahead. Click on any green/available start date to begin your 6-week reservation. “Available Now” titles can be picked up immediately.
- Overlap your reservations so you can collect one title and pass out the next title at your monthly meeting.
- Plan up to a year in advance to reserve popular titles for your discussion group.
- Pick up and return your Book Group in a Bag kit at the Reference Desk in the library.
- Add Authorized Users on your reservation to let a friend pick up your kit.
- Book Group in a Bag kits check out for 6 weeks and are not renewable.
- Late fees for Book Group in a Bag kits are \$1 per day up to a maximum of \$10.
